How has your support made a difference?

T.A.F.F.Y. raised over \$15,000 in 2011 and the following stories are just a few examples of the local families we've helped this year thanks to your support.

- Megan, a 32 year-old mother of two, was diagnosed with brain cancer last summer. Treatments have shrunk the tumor but doctors say there is no cure for her type of cancer. Megan will continue treatment for as long as she lives to keep the tumor from growing. She would also like to seek alternative treatments but that costs money. T.A.F.F.Y. raised \$3,000 for Megan and her family to help alleviate their financial burden.
- Greg, a 44 year-old father of four, recently suffered a debilitating heart attack. He spent two weeks in Intensive Care and is slowly making progress. Medical bills have been piling up. Greg's wife is currently employed but her income is only enough to cover the costs of their daily living and it will be months before Greg will be well enough work. T.A.F.F.Y. organized two fundraisers to help Greg and his family make ends meet.
- Lisa, a wife and mother battled breast cancer this past year. Happily after a double masectomy, chemo and radiation, and a partial hysterectomy, she is cancer free. T.A.F.F.Y. donated \$1,000 to Lisa and her family to help with bills and health care costs.
- Anne, a Westland school district art teacher, spends much of her own money each year on supplies for her students. With no budget to provide supplies for her special ed students. T.A.F.F.Y. donated \$500 to Anne so that she could buy what she needed.

T.A.F.F.Y. joins forces with Woodward Academy

During this Christmas season, T.A.F.F.Y. joined forces with the Woodward Academy, a charter school located in downtown Detroit. T.A.F.F.Y. answered the call by adopting a total of five families whose children attend the Academy. These families requested help to provide a proper Christmas for their children.. T.A.F.F.Y. was more than happy to help these families who were suffering from setbacks including unemployment, homelessness, and being a

single parent household trying to provide for their families. Each family member received clothing items, a toy, books, and a game for the families to enjoy together. When the presents were delivered the families were overjoyed and extremely thankful. T.A.F.F.Y. was grateful to be able to help out others in their time of need, especially when it meant providing a Christmas for children and families who might not have been able to enjoy one otherwise.
